Brief History:

In a visionary move to transform the landscape of health sciences education in Maharashtra, the Government of Maharashtra established the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences (MUHS) on 3rd June 1998 under the MUHS Act, 1998. The University was conceived to bring all health science education under a unified, structured, and progressive framework - ensuring academic excellence, uniformity in curricula, and the promotion of high-impact research across disciplines.

MUHS was initially housed at Gangapur Road, Nashik, and later shifted in 2004 to its expansive and purpose-built campus at Mhasrul, Dindori Road, Nashik, marking the beginning of a new era in health sciences governance and academic leadership.

As a teaching and affiliating University, MUHS today stands as a pillar of healthcare education, overseeing more than 400 affiliated institutions across the state. It integrates the richness of both modern medicine and the Indian systems of medicine, cultivating a generation of healthcare professionals committed to excellence, ethics, and service.

With a clear strategic vision, MUHS is not only shaping the future of medical education in Maharashtra but also contributing significantly to the nation's health system. Its unwavering commitment to quality, innovation, and inclusivity continues to uplift the standards of health sciences education, research, and practice-ensuring healthier futures for generations to come.

1) Objectives :-

As per MUHS Act 1998, u/s 4, the objectives of the University are;

- (j) to strive to promote competitive merit and excellence as the sole guiding criterion in all academic and other matters relating to students.
- (k) to impart education and training to achieve the goal of physical, mental, and spiritual health of every individual.
- (l) to create a better understanding between different systems of medicines through interdisciplinary study and research ;
- (m) to establish and develop Indian Systems or Medicine so as to keep he of a healthy individual and to cure the disease or diseased individual.

University Research Department:

The **University Research Department** acts as a powerhouse of innovation and scholarly rigour, fostering interdisciplinary research, grant facilitation, ethical oversight, and capacity-building across affiliated institutions-establishing MUHS as a beacon of academic leadership in health sciences. The University encourages faculty and students to engage in meaningful research projects that address pressing healthcare challenges by providing funding through the research Schemes: Short Term Research Grant, Long Term Research Grant, Intra Mural Research, IMPACT, Financial Assistance for organizing Conference/ Workshops, Publication Grant and travel Grant schemes. Department is involved in imparting Ph.D. programme, Training of Basic Research Methodology, Advance Research Methodology and Good Clinical Practices. URD also undertakes activities of MUHS Health Sciences Review Journal and MUHS Institutional Ethics Committee.

MUHS Research Laboratory is established in MUHS campus and it is upgraded with a state- of- the art High- Performance Liquid Chromatography (HPLC) equipment, which enhances advance research capabilities.

Tripartite Collaboration among MUHS, IIT Bombay and SANGAM Foundation for fostering interdisciplinary learning and impactful public health advancements and launching a Fellowship Course in Applied Public Health Practices.

MUHS initiated Translational Research Activities in collaboration with the American Nephrology Society, Seth G. S. Medical College, Mumbai and IIT Mumbai marking a significant step toward impactful applied research.

Faculty-wise State-Level Research Competitions are conducted for both students and teachers from MUHS-affiliated colleges, fostering a culture of innovation and academic excellence.

Institute of Medical Education Technology & Teachers Training (IMETTT)

The Institute of Medical Education Technology & Teachers Training (IMETTT), established in May 2007, stands as a pioneering Medical Education Technology (MET) department within a health university in India. It operates under the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences (MUHS) with a vision to enhance health sciences education through quality curricula development, faculty training, and capacity building. IMETTT serves as a National Medical Commission (NMC) Regional Centre for Faculty Development since 2011, entrusted with training trainers and overseeing curricular governance across all medical colleges affiliated to MUHS. The department also conducts workshops and programs, including the NMC Basic Course in Medical Education (BCME) and Curriculum Implementation Support Program (CISP), achieving over 90% training completion in recent years.

IMETTT's role extends beyond medical education to other health sciences education domains such as Ayurveda, Homoeopathy, Physiotherapy, and Nursing. It offers a spectrum of in-house Faculty Development Programs (FDPs), including foundational and advanced courses in Health Sciences Education Technology (HSET), curriculum development workshops, and leadership training. The department actively supports competency-based medical education (CBME) implementation through feedback mechanisms, handholding college-level FDPs, and acting as a liaison between colleges and the NMC. Over 200,000 faculty members have been trained through its initiatives in the last 18 years.

In recent years, IMETTT has organized a wide variety of workshops and seminars addressing topics such as clinical and laboratory good practices, leadership, assessment reforms, and digital health. It also plans to expand its offerings by introducing refresher courses, webinars, and targeted workshops aligned with evolving educational needs for all MUHS-affiliated colleges.

Blueprinting workshops on examination related matters for Medical, Nursing, Physiotherapy have been successfully conducted by the department. Faculty development workshops in other domains like Leadership and administration, LIC inspections, assessment reforms, etc. is also conducted. Curriculum development of Fellowship in Integrated Family Medicine (Graduate) was undertaken by the dept.

In future IMETTT department plans for Refresher courses, Online webinars, One-day targeted need based workshops on the CBME topics, Workshops/ webinars on other domains- research, leadership, Curriculum implementation support programs for the new competency-based curricula of Ayurveda, Homoeopathy and Physiotherapy etc. for all MUHS affiliated colleges.

Department of AYUSH :

This department promotes integrative, holistic healthcare by bridging traditional Indian medical systems with modern scientific approaches, fostering research and education in Ayurveda, Yoga, Unani, Siddha, and Homoeopathy.

Department conducts Ph.D. (Ayurved), Fellowship (Yoga Therapy) and Panchkarma Fellowship Courses. Apart from this, academic work is undertaken by the department such as, syllabus designing , online clinical meetings, workshops, conferences, student internship program, interdisciplinary research projects etc. An estimated 20,000+ students have been benefited from online interdisciplinary clinical meetings.

The department has also supported in formulation of syllabus for Family Medicine fellowship course (Ayurved module), Basics of Ayurveda for degree plus courses & D-Pharma Ayurveda.

Prakruti Wellness Center is established under Department of AYUSH in June 2023 and more than 500 patients are benefited by ayurveda treatment including Panchkarma.

The department has dealt with chronic patients of frozen shoulder, osteoarthritis, chronic cough, childhood asthma, ligament tear, gout, pyrexia of unknown origin etc. by pure ayurveda.

"Rashi Udyan" is also established in the University premises. Approx. 1000 medicinal plants on University campus are labelled with QR coded information so that information about the usefulness of each medicinal plant is available.

The "Desh Ka Prakriti Parikshan Abhiyan" has been implemented under the concept of our Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. More than 40 lakh people have been benefited so far through the University affiliated colleges. The health of the citizens has been determined under this program.

Department of AYUSH has successfully conducted and contributed in 2 international conferences i.e. Jigyasa at Nashik – 2024 & Ayur-Health Summit at Vietnam 2025.

DRISHTI:

DRISHTI (Division of Research in Interdisciplinary Sciences, Healthcare & Translational Innovations) is established at MUHS, Nashik, which is a dynamic hub for interdisciplinary and translational research in health sciences. It leads multi-centric clinical trials, organizes capacity-building workshops, and offers structured Pre-Ph.D. training. Notable collaborations include NCCS Pune, IISER Pune, and CCRAS, Ministry of AYUSH, focusing on Ayurgenomics, drug standardisation, and advanced instrumentation.

Department of Pharmaceutical Medicine :

The Department of Pharmaceutical Medicine is at the forefront of clinical research, drug development, and regulatory sciences, producing professionals equipped to lead in an era of evidence-based therapeutics and precision medicine.

The Department conduct M.Sc. in Pharmaceutical Medicine (Post Graduate), UGC approved program, started by the MUHS in 2007. Syllabus of this course is restructured as per NEP 2020 policy. The course also focuses on Community Engagement and Social Responsibility including Field Visits and Study Tours.

The department has actively contributed in Oral & Poster Presentations, Publications and Summer Internship Program activities. Faculty & students have participated in International and National Conference and workshops. Brainstorming sessions are organised for capacity building in Clinical studies/ Clinical Research for Under Graduate, Post Graduate students & Teachers.

The department has signed MoU with ICMR-NIRRH, Mumbai, Model Rural Health Research Unit (MRHRU), Nashik, MIT School of Bioengineering Sciences & Research (constituent Unit of MIT ADT University, Pune), ToxIndia, Pune and RAP Analytical Research Private Limited, Nashik.

Placement supports is provided by the department to the enrolled students. Some students are placed with eminent organisations / laboratories such as ICMR-NIRRH, Mumbai, Vital Healthcare Pvt. Ltd., Hospital Ethics Committees etc.

Department of Tribal Health, Nagpur

This department is established by the University to deal with issues faced by tribals.

BLOSSOM (Breast, Liver, Osteoporosis, Sickle cell, Sexually transmitted diseases, Oral cancer and Malnutrition) Research Project is carried out by the University through its Nagpur Regional Center which is the India's biggest tribal health surveillance project in Vidarbha region of Maharashtra. Health screening and surveillance of diseases of more than 6389 triable population from 18 villages having 85% tribal population in four districts of Maharashtra have been done under this project.

Apart from this, International Symposium on Tribal Health FIST-2025 was organized by the University in collaboration with AIIMS, Nagpur International speakers from more than 15 countries and 20 speakers of National repute have participated and shared their views in this symposium. 1042 delegated have attended this symposium. The outcome of expert's discussions in this symposium will be submitted to the Central Govt. and the State Government in the form of recommendations.

Regional Centers of MUHS and its activities :

Apart from this, Teacher approval proposals, Eligibility proposals and Examination forms of affiliated colleges are processed at Regional Centre level.
- 2) **At Regional Centre, Pune**, MBA (HCA) course is conducted under School of Health Care Administration & MPH (N) course is conducted under Department of Public Health & Nutrition. Apart from this, a state-of-art laboratory is established by the University to carry out specialized tests under Genetics & Immunology Laboratory. Further, Certificate course in Genetic Diagnostics and Fellowship in Clinical & Laboratory Genetic are undertaken.
Apart from this, Teacher approval proposals, Eligibility proposals and Examination forms of affiliated colleges are processed at Regional Centre level.
- 3) **At Regional Centre, Chh. Sambhajinagar**, Diploma courses in Ophthalmic Science and Optometry are conducted under Department of Ophthalmic Science and Optometry.
Apart from this, Teacher approval proposals, Eligibility proposals and Examination forms of affiliated colleges are processed at Regional Centre level.
- 4) **At Regional Centre, Nagpur**, research activities related to Tribal Health are undertaken. Further, International and national-level workshops/ seminars are organised on study of tribal.
Apart from this, Teacher approval proposals, Eligibility proposals and Examination forms of affiliated colleges are processed at Regional Centre level
- 5) **At Regional Centre, Kolhapur**, Teacher approval proposals, Eligibility proposals and Examination forms of affiliated colleges are processed at the Regional Centre level.
- 6) **At Regional Centre, Latur**, apart from research activities, teacher approval proposals, Eligibility proposals and Examination forms of affiliated colleges are processed at Regional Centre level.

Manpower Status of MUHS :

University has submitted 705 posts Non-teaching staffing pattern proposal to the State Govt. for approval, which is pending at the State Govt. level. At present, the State Govt. has sanctioned 233 non-teaching posts on MUHS establishment. However, 175 staff is working on MUHS establishment. Due to increase in number of affiliated colleges, workload at MUHS level has drastically increased. To cater day to day work, University has appointed 136 staff on temporary basis from University fund as well as has taken support of 328 manpower on contractual basis through Outsourcing Agencies. However, University needs regular permanent non-teaching staff to carry-out its day to day work.

Apart from this, University has established a separate Teaching Wing comprising of 11 departments to carry out research & teaching activities. At present, 01 Dean (Academics), 06 Professor, 06 Associate Professor & 10 Assistant Professor, 01 Senior Optometrist are appointed by the University for functioning of the respective departments.

University organizes training sessions for University Officers/ Employees from time to time.

- From the Summer 2023 session, it has become possible to evaluate written answer sheets online through candidates (Peripheral Scanning Assessment Programme) and to declare the results of university-affiliated courses within 13 days. Also, since the evaluation of written answer sheets is done online, it has become possible to provide

the photocopy of the answer sheet to the concerned students within 7 days from the date of submitting an application to the examination department for obtaining the photocopy of the written answer sheet.

- Question Paper Management System [QPMS] is a computer-based system for sending university written examination question papers to exam centers online. From the Winter-2024 session until today, an average of 78% of the work for examinations has been completed online through the online software.
- PET – 2025 was conducted online for the first time.
- Implementation of the Examiners Panel through computer software.
- Necessary standard operating procedures were developed regarding the work in the examination department.
- The necessary procedures related to the University Examinations Management Systems (UEMS) have been initiated. Various modules have been created under this, and actions are being carried out accordingly.
- Till date around 1,29,597 ABC ID have been created as per NEP - 2020.
- Total 2,37,073 Degree Certificates uploaded on Digi-locker.
- Total 3,530 Post Graduate (Allied) Marksheet uploaded on Digi-locker.

Students' Welfare Department :

The Student Welfare Department is responsible for student well-being and development through academic support, financial aid, and co-curricular activities as well as act as a liaison between students, parents, and administration. Key roles include providing scholarships, various schemes for students, resolving student grievances and organizing activities that promote overall personality development of students. Anti Ragging Cell and SC, ST, OBC Cell are also constituted at University level as per UGC guidelines .

Finance and Accounts Department :

The Finance & Accounts Department is responsible for overseeing all financial operations including Budget and Budgetary control, fund allocation and accounting. Key duties include managing the University's funds, Investments, Receipt - Payment of Accounts, Balance Sheet, Annual Accounts, Audit & Passing of all bills and to maintain all records of Receipts. The department also ensures adherence to financial rules and regulations and manages internal controls to prevent financial irregularities as well as comply as per statutory and A.G. Audit reports. Finance department is completely digitized and all payments are done through E-Payment. Therefore, the time required for the financial transactions of the University is reduced and the work is streamlined with accuracy.

Accounts Code :

A new Account Code for the University has been implemented from June 2022, after comprehensive consideration of various issues. Due to this accounting code, the functioning of the University has been streamlined and financial discipline has been established in the accounting transactions.

Online fee payment facility :

By making UPI and Online facility available. It has become convenient for the college, students and parents to pay the fee online and the hassle of the college, students and parents has come to an end.

Digitization of previous financial records :

Financial records need to be preserved for longer period. However, it is difficult to preserve old financial records in proper way and therefore, the Finance and Accounts department has scanned all previous records/ documents from 1998 to March 2024, that will facilitate long term preservation of documents in their original form and making them available quickly as and when required.

Purchase department and Central Store Department also function under Finance & Accounts department.

Eligibility Department :

Eligibility department grants eligibility & enrolment registration to the students admitted in Under-Graduate, Post Graduate (PG), PG Diploma, Super Specialty, Ph.D., Fellowship and Certificate Courses. Eligibility department is completely digitalized and major activities of the department is carried out through online system. University Migration Certificate to the Students by the Eligibility department.

This department maintains and update College-wise and Course-wise Statistical data of admitted students year-wise. Statistical information is provided to various Government offices as and when required.

This department also conducts Workshop on Statistical Data Analysis for University Ph.D. Scholars.

Law and Grievances Department:

- The Law and Grievances Department mainly deals with legal affairs, Consumer Protection Act, etc. and legal matters of the University, the petitions / cases filed by or against the University before Hon'ble High Court, Hon'ble Supreme Court, and other Competent Courts.
- The department is providing legal opinions on several legal issues such as implementation of Court orders, submissions before the Court, administrative and establishment related issues etc.
- The Law and Grievances Department also deals with Grievance Appeals (Grievance application received from complainant i.e. the teaching / non-teaching staff of the University and / or affiliated colleges under the provision of Section 53 of MUHS Act 1998.

Administration Department :

Administration department majorly deals with organizing University Authorities meetings such as the Senate, the Management Council and the Academic Council. Main Inward and Outward (dispatch) section of the University function under this department which is completely digitalized now. This department deal with University Diary, Annual Report and the monthly and quarterly reports to be submitted to the Hon'ble Governor Office.

Conduct of various Elections related to University are undertaken by this department. Vehicle department, Security Staff management and University Guest House also functions under Administration department.

Computer Department (Software) :

- Software development from C-DAC for entire University Automation.
- Maintenance of MUHS website, Intranet portal, Chakra portal, University Teaching Wing (Disha), Drishti portal.

- Regular activities of maintenance of master database like College, Courses, Courses in College, Departments, Posts etc.
- Maintenance of Google workspace & Email System free of cost with 100 TB cloud workspace.
- Maintenance of LMS System

Public Relation Department :

1. To process information about various activities of the University through various communication media such as news, articles, various media, news channels, radio, web portals, digital media, channels etc.
2. To take action to publish advertisements of various departments of the University including notifications, advertisement notices, recruitment process etc. in newspapers at government rates.
3. Organising press conferences as directed by Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor and the Registrar.
4. Preparation of reports, articles on various activities of the University and follow up action on publication in newspapers.
5. To produce and disseminate short films, documentaries etc. for audio-visual and internet media as per the mandate received from various activities of the University.
6. Publication of photographs of various events of the University, workshops, seminars, meetings, felicitations, visits of dignitaries, news published in the media, messages, etc. on the social media accounts of the university on Facebook, X (Twitter), YouTube, Linked-in etc. as per the orders.
7. The birth anniversary and day celebrations events of various eminent personalities is organized in the University as per the State Government order.
8. Activities of 'IKSHANA' Museum is undertaken by this department as per the instructions of the Vice-Chancellor and the Registrar.

Library :

The Library Department serves as the central hub for academic, research, and clinical learning, offering specialized resources, digital tools, and support services to empower both students and faculty. Library offers Digital Library & E-Resources, Reference & Research Support, MUHS-Digital-Consortia & University Thesis Deposited in Shodhganga. Around 245 Ph.D. thesis awarded by the University have been uploaded on Shodhganga.

Health Center

The University has a well equipped Health Centre on its campus with an aim to promote well being of the Students and Staff of the University. It provides primary Health Care Services to the University staff. Free medication is provided to the Students and Staff. Annual Health Checkup is also provided by the University to the Students and Staff. Consulting services on weekly basis of Homoeopathy, Physiotherapy and Clinical Psychology OPD is also available at the Health Centre.

Mental Health and Counseling Services is also provided by the Health Center. Facility of 24/7 Cardiac Ambulance services is also available for University staff and students.

Health Education and Awareness activity are organized by the Health Center from time to time.

Jan Aushadhi Kendra is established at Health Center and generic medicines are provided to MUHS Staff.

MUHS-DISHA:

One of the University's notable achievements is the establishment of incubation centers for healthcare startups. To achieve its purpose DISHA (Department of Innovations and Systems for Healthcare Associations), a separate Section-8 Company has been established under MUHS.

These centers provide budding entrepreneurs with the resources, mentorship, and funding needed to transform innovative ideas into viable solutions. MUHS is driving innovation in areas such as medical devices, AYUSH, digital health, and pharmaceuticals. MUHS-DISHA is established for encouraging entrepreneurship and innovations among Students and Teachers of the affiliated colleges to the University.

CHAKRA:

MUHS aims to expand its global footprint by forging stronger ties with international universities and research organizations. By staying ahead of industry trends, MUHS is poised to remain a leader in health sciences education and research. University has established Centre of Excellence (CoE), CHAKRA (Centre for Health Applied Knowledge & Research Autonomy), a separate Section-8 Company under MUHS. It's Hub and Spoke model comprises of verticals like Faculty Development Academy, Incubation Centre, Digital Health, Simulation Lab and Clinical Trial Unit.
